First cohort - 9 of 11 graduated college in 2011 in four years; 2 are still enrolled as undergraduates.

Second cohort – 7 of 9 graduated college in 2012 in four years; 2 are still enrolled as undergraduates.

Third cohort-13 of 17 graduated college in 2013 in four years; 4 are still enrolled as undergraduates.

### **DTP Infrastructure & Sustainability**

- Over the course of the first of six years of the DTP we have built an infrastructure that is designed to sustain the program at a decreasing cost per young man.
- The initial per young man cost figures in 2007 were approximately \$3,500.00.
- The 2013-14 cohort, the per young man costs are approximately \$1,100.00. The reduction is due in large part to planned sustainability activities that include:
  - development of a sustainable instructional website;
  - continuing mentor/teaching training program;
  - decreased cost of technology;
  - partnership with Southern Connecticut State University;
  - school/community support for the transportation of our young men to Academic Saturday; and
  - School support for DTP school coordinators.

### **DTP Cost Per Young Man**

The 2013-14 cohort of 50 young men, cost per young man is \$1,020.00.

### **Participating Schools**

The number of secondary schools requesting to participate in the DTP has increased each year.
